Cancer Council Information and Support 13 11 20	This confidential telephone service is staffed by trained health professionals who can provide information about any aspect of cancer. Our 13 11 20 consultants can send you printed information, connect you with counselling and support services in your local area, and provide emotional support.

Information can be read online or downloaded as PDFs and often as ebooks. You can also find links to a range of support services for people affected by cancer.
