

HOW TO APPLY FOR A WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK - VOLUNTEERS

Process

<p>Who need the Working-with-Children- Check?</p>	<p>Working with Children Check</p> <p>Volunteers need the check if they are in an identified position, or if their manager determines it is necessary for the duties of the role.</p> <p>Volunteers are responsible for obtaining the Working with Children Check by completing an online application and then visiting the nearest Service NSW along with an identification to complete the application process.</p> <p>The WWCC is free for volunteers.</p>
<p>How do I apply for the Check?</p>	<p>If you already have a WWCC number, please notify volunteervacancies@nswcc.org.au with the APP/WWC number, your full name and your date of birth, so we can verify this.</p> <p>If you have a WWCC number but can't locate it, you can retrieve it by clicking here.</p> <p>If you need to apply for a WWCC, please click here. Once this has been submitted, you'll receive an application number, which you will need to take to your nearest Service Centre along with your identification to complete the application process.</p> <p>WWCC's for volunteers are free, and when completing the form online, please choose the following options:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check purpose - Volunteer, authorised carer, adult household member, student on a professional placement, prospective adoptive parent • Child related sector - Clubs or other bodies providing services to children <p>Once it has been processed, you will receive your WWCC number, please notify us so we can verify this. It can take up to 4 weeks to process.</p>
