

WHO IS THIS TOOLKIT FOR?

This toolkit is for students wanting to drive better sun safe practices at their school. It is designed to help those students implement a Sun Safe Initiative and choose one thing to **engage**, **educate**, and **empower** the school community to make impactful and lasting changes to sun safe practices. This toolkit and supporting resources provide students with the opportunity to further develop their own personal and social capabilities and build on their skills as learners now and into the future.

HOW TO USE THIS TOOLKIT

Students use this toolkit to build knowledge and understanding around why sun safety is important and how students are in a unique position to help promote positive sun safe practices. Cancer Council have provided key information around choosing and implementing the right Sun Safe Initiative, and key drivers for a successful and sustainable initiative.

YOU AND YOUR SCHOOL.

THE ROLE OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Secondary schools are in a unique position to increase awareness of sun protection across their school community and establish best-practice sun protection among young people.

Secondary schools can play a leading role in sun protection for students by:

- Building on the positive sun protection behaviours and attitudes learnt through earlier education
- Protecting students when the UV level reaches 3 or above
- Influencing sun protection attitudes and behaviours through education and role modelling.

What can you do to help your peers?

You can help your peers by choosing one thing. One Sun Safe Initiative can make a huge difference in sun protection awareness and action in your school community.

Research has shown that adolescents are more likely to adopt healthy behaviours if their peers do. Peers have a powerful influence on each other and your influence and actions can make a real and lasting difference!

By taking action, you can make a positive impact on your and your community's health and wellbeing. Taking on a Sun Safe Initiative means you are building essential skills that develop your personal and social capabilities as well.

Let's reflect!

Sometimes deciding can be the hardest part! Reflecting on you and the school's capabilities will assist in making an informed decision and help you find an initiative that is set up for success. Reflecting also helps to identify and define the intention and objective that will drive this initiative. Complete the reflection activities below to identify key information about you and your school and then link that information to key attributes of the Sun Safe Initiatives.



TIP:

The information gathered below can be used in different ways. You can identify skills and capabilities to develop and select an initiative accordingly, rather than solely focusing on your strengths. Additionally, you may identify existing sun safe practices in the school and aim to enhance them for maximum impact and success, instead of addressing areas that need attention.

REFLECTING ON MY SKILLS, INTERESTS, AND CAPABILITIES:

Understanding you and your team:

It's important to reflect on you and your team's skills, interests and capabilities so you can set your intentions and goals and be the best champion you can be.

From the information gathered above identify those Sun Safe Initiatives that capitalise on your strengths, and those initiatives that will develop the skills and capabilities you want to improve. Once you know more about you and your team, then reflect on your school. Use the activity on the next page to identify key information about your school.

REFLECTING ON SUN SAFE PRACTICES AT SCHOOL:

Understanding your school environment

When making decisions it's important to know what environment you're working in. This reflective activity helps you to identify current practices at the school that you may want to improve on or areas where there are little to no sun safe practices.

Supporting learning about sun safety For example, is it in the curriculum or do we read about it in the newsletter and on the school's Facebook page? Does our school post sun safe suggestions on their Facebook page or through other channels like the school newsletter, daily bulletin or promotional posters across the school? 			
Supporting sun safe behaviours For example, wearing hats or using sunscreen.	 Does our school have sunscreen available to put on during outdoor activities? Do students wear sunscreen regularly as part of their daily routine? Do we have to wear sun protective clothing during outdoor activities like at athletics carnivals? Does our school promote slip, slop, slap, seek and slide? 			



TIP:

Use the information gathered above to strategise. You may have identified that the school has lots of shade but doesn't regularly encourage students to seek shade during peak sun hours, OR, you may have identified that the school has sunscreen available but the school doesn't promote wearing it. On page 6, look at the 'Category' of the Sun Safe Initiative - **Environmental, Curricula, Behavioural** - and identify what Sun Safe Initiatives can help strengthen current practices at the school or fill the gaps in sun safe practices.

SUN SAFE INITIATIVES AT A GLANCE.

Encourage staff and students to think about the protective measure of seeking shade during peak sun hours.

SunSmart App CURRICULA

Build awareness of ultraviolet (UV) radiation in your school community. Propose the adoption of the **SunSmart** App and **SunSmart** Widget across the school and make informed sun safe choices on a daily basis.

Comms Campaign CURRICULA

Encourage staff and students to consider the harmful effects of UV and why it's crucial that adolescents in particular take protective measures in sun safety.

Sunscreen Station BEHAVIOURAL

Encourage staff and students to think about the protective measure of applying sunscreen before heading outdoors.

Build awareness of sun safe clothing and celebrate the efforts of the school community in demonstrating sun safe protective practices.


CREATING COMMUNITIES THAT CARE.

Champions, you have a collaborative ecosystem where you can seek guidance and support. Connect with your community, find people and resources that can help drive your Sun Safe Initiative and set you up for success.

There will be key staff that can help with resources and understanding school policies and guidelines to ensure your initiative links with existing school practices. Your peer community can help you build your team or you may even join forces with an existing student council or group.

Your parent and carer community is there for support and resources and are often a great source for fundraising.

Lastly, the wider community will often provide aid or sponsorship to help your initiative along. Don't be afraid to reach out!



LEADERSHIP BUY-IN

Once you've considered the Sun Safe Initiatives that align to you and your school, you'll need to seek approval from school leadership. It is important to get school leadership buy-in so you have the support and resources needed for a successful initiative.

Key factors for leadership buy-in:

- This initiative is aligned to curriculum and key educational frameworks and policies.
- This initiative helps foster the health and wellbeing of the whole school community.
- This initiative is designed to have a positive impact on the school.
- Highlight the alarming statistics around adolescent risks of skin cancer.
- Highlight how secondary schools are in a unique position to make a real and lasting difference.
- Use the Pitch Plan example in the Initiative Guide for more guidance on school leadership buy-in.

BRINGING OTHERS ALONG FOR THE JOURNEY.
