OVERVIEW

The Cancer Council SA Research Program considers near miss applications to the NHMRC Ideas Grant round for supplementary funding. Processing of applications for Cancer Council SA supplementary funding is jointly managed by CCNSW and Cancer Council SA.

Cancer Council SA Research Program supplementary funding is available to applications that are:

- Based on any aspect of cancer, including its causes, mechanisms, prevention, treatment and care, and the organisation and performance of cancer control services
- 1 year in duration
- Have an adjusted 12-month timeline and budget up to a value of \$100,000
- Based in South Australia

Researchers wishing to apply to the Cancer Council SA Research Program must complete:

- An NHMRC Ideas Grant application in SAPPHERE
- The Cancer Council SA supplementary questions via the CCNSW online form

HOW TO APPLY

1. NHMRC IDEAS GRANT APPLICATION

Visit the NHMRC website for information about submitting an NHMRC Ideas Grant application and how to access Sapphire. Once an Ideas Grant application is started in SAPPHERE, select 'Cancer Council' under the '*Funding Sources*' Tab. Failure to do so will mean NHMRC is unable to forward the application to Cancer Council.

2. SUPPLEMENTARY QUESTIONS

In addition to the NHMRC Ideas Grant application, applicants will need to complete a set of Supplementary Questions via an [Online form](#). Please select 'Cancer Council SA' on page 1 to be considered for Cancer Council SA Research Program supplementary funding.

Important to note:

In order for NHMRC to pass on application data to Cancer Councils, applicants need to select "Cancer Council" as the funding option in SAPPHIRE, under the '*Funding Source*' Tab.

Under the '*Application Details*' tab in SAPPHIRE, applicants also need to provide consent to the privacy clause for the NHMRC to be able to release the application.

The same application ID must be used on the NHMRC application form and Supplementary Questions online form.

For applicants who wish to apply to both Cancer Council SA and Cancer Council NSW supplementary funding, only one Supplementary Questions [online form](#) needs to be completed.

The Supplementary Questions will not be available to the NHMRC Grant Review Panels (GRPs) but will be for the exclusive use of the Cancer Council SA Research Program to assist in funding decisions. Applicants are strongly advised to familiarise themselves with the Specific State Criteria which are identified below.

SPECIFIC STATE CRITERIA

In the [Supplementary Questions form](#) (Specific State criteria), Cancer Council SA funding applicants must demonstrate the following attributes (5000 characters):

- **Scientific impact, innovation and quality:** Outline significance, innovation and potential impact of the project on discovering and improving prevention/detection/treatment or care for people affected by cancer. Please include quality of research design and rationale.
- **Collaboration:** include clear evidence of collaboration in the past five years at a local, national and international level (e.g., as in grant applications, co-authorship of papers and conference presentations). The roles of any collaborating partners in the present proposal should be clearly outlined. Collaborators may include other researchers, policy makers, service providers and/or community representatives.
- **Consumer and Community Engagement:** Outline the Consumer and Community engagement strategy associated with this application.

Applicants should demonstrate the following attributes, if applicable:

- **Health Inequities:** detail how this research addresses any health inequities in priority areas in South Australia, including but not limited to; Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, Culturally and Linguistically diverse and rural and remote areas, and also clearly indicate which inequity is being addressed.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA AND GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS

Applicants ineligible to apply for NHMRC Ideas Grant funding are still eligible to apply via the NHMRC process for Cancer Council SA Research Program funding.

Applicants need to adhere to Cancer Council SA Research Program eligibility criteria as well as that of the NHMRC if they are applying for funding from both organisations. These are available on their respective websites.

Eligible applications may come from across the research spectrum including clinical, health-services and population-health and biomedical research.

ASSESSMENT

All cancer research grant applications will be assessed and ranked via the NHMRC Ideas Grant process. Applications will be assessed based on NHMRC ranking and Specific State Criteria.

Please note: While all cancer research grant applications will be assessed via the NHMRC process, Cancer Councils will continue to make the funding decisions and reserve the right not to grant funding in any grant round.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Applications are to follow the NHMRC format. The relevance of the research to cancer must be explicit in the application and research must be carried out in South Australia.

Only one project per Chief Investigator (CI) will be funded. It is permissible to submit the same grant for funding to Cancer Australia, Cancer Council NSW and Cancer Council SA Research Program but funding would be forthcoming from one source only.

Sequence of investigators

The list and sequence of all named Chief Investigators on the application must be the same as that of the NHMRC application.

Duration and funding available for a given grant

Projects funded will generally be for one year beginning 1st January 2025. Cancer Council SA Research Program funding should not be used as a source of ongoing salary funding for senior career scientists. Up to \$100,000 will be available per project.

Cancer Council SA Research Program Funding will generally not fund the salary of Chief Investigator A (CIA). Salary requests for CIB, CIC, CID etc will be permitted provided the salary is not being requested to support someone who is a group leader or head of laboratory.

Payment of funds

Grant payments will be made to the South Australian Administering Institution nominated in the successful grant application. Grants are paid in two instalments on receipt of a tax invoice from the Administering Institution. Amounts granted are exclusive of GST.

Publicity

Successful applicants may be asked to assist with promotion of funded research and of funding partners. It is possible for example that there will be requests to provide media publicity through interviews or other means and we hope that successful applicants will be able to participate when these opportunities arise. We shall also ask successful applicants to advise the Cancer Council SA Research Program secretariat if promotion of funded work is planned through host institutions. All publications resulting from this funding should include the following acknowledgment: **“This research was supported by the Cancer Council SA Research Program- NHMRC Near Miss Ideas Grants, on behalf of its generous donors.”**

Reporting

You will be required to report against the first six months of the grant for the first reporting period and the remaining six months of the grant in the next reporting period. Failure to submit a report may render investigators on the grant application ineligible for further funding until the report is received.

Successful applicants

An agreement with successful applicants will be finalised setting out terms and conditions of funding.

Tobacco Policy

Funding will not be offered for individuals or institutions who receive support directly or indirectly from or are involved with organisations that are part of or funded by the tobacco industry. Applicants are asked to disclose any current or recent relationship with the tobacco industry. Unless counterevidence is supplied, such relationships will be taken as conflict of interest and render applicants ineligible.

Use of Research Funds

The funds offered are a grant-in-aid and will not be supplemented. It is the responsibility of the grant holder to manage salaries and other expenditure within the limits of the grant.

Unspent Funds

Unexpended money must be returned to Cancer Council SA. Funding may not be carried over into the following year.
